## Rogers Expanding Service Along Pine Pass



Addressing gaps in cellular coverage between Chetwynd and the Highway 39 intersection north into MacKenzie, Rogers Communications will be adding 6 new cell towers with 69 km of continuous coverage.

Construction on the project began in the spring of 2022 with work on 5 of the 6 towers started. The project is expected to be completed through early 2023 with towers going live in stages as the work is completed. The first tower, Azouzetta Lake Area near Powder King is already live to traffic.



Construction is underway at five of the six towers.



The expansion program is being supported with \$5.4 million in funding from the Connecting British Columbia program administered by Northern Development Initiative Trust. The mandate of the Connecting British Columbia program is "...to help internet service providers and regional and local governments connect people in rural and Indigenous communities with high-speed internet". Other projects currently supporting by this program include 150 km of fibre along highway 29 between Fort St John and Chetwynd with 9 points-of-presence including East Moberly Lake 169 (Saulteau First Nations) and West Moberly Lake 168A (West Moberly First Nations) in conjunction with Shaw Cablesystems.

### NOTICE TO HOMEOWNERS FOR YOUR 2022 TAXES, UTILITIES AND HOME OWNER GRANTS



If you are eligible for the HOME OWNER GRANT and have not claimed the grant for the 2022 taxation year, please apply online at [www.gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant](http://www.gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant), and or phone 1-888-355-2700 and or apply directly at Service BC and or located on our District of Chetwynd website under "Apply For", until December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022.

Your bank may pay your property taxes, however they can't claim your Home Owner Grant. Please ensure you have either claimed the grant or paid the equivalent amount.

As of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 all outstanding balances in either current taxes or utilities, will be transferred January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023 to property taxes arrears. Property Taxes in arrears on January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2023 will be transferred to delinquent taxes. Property taxes in arrears and delinquent will accrue interest at the rate prescribed by the Provincial Government, currently 8.45%. The interest rate is subject to change.

Deadline to pay outstanding delinquent taxes will be September 25<sup>th</sup>, 2023 by 9:59am; otherwise your property will be sold in the Tax Sale September 25<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at 10:00am.

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## ***ICBC files for no increase to basic insurance rates for two more years***

Government reforms to ICBC are paying off with affordable, steady rates and fiscal stability for people.

ICBC is filing an application with the British Columbia Utilities Commission (BCUC) for no increase to basic insurance rates for the next two years, which marks five years of no increases to basic insurance rates.

"Our government is committed to keeping costs down for all British Columbians," said Premier David Eby. "Holding firm on ICBC's basic insurance rate for two more years will help millions of drivers with their monthly bills amid global inflation."

With the introduction of Enhanced Care in May 2021, auto insurance rates in British Columbia have gone from some of the most expensive in Canada to being among the most affordable. A Canada-wide rate comparison report by Ernst & Young looked at 30 different driver profiles and compared how much auto insurance would cost in nine provinces across Canada. The report found that British Columbians pay among the lowest auto insurance rates in Canada.

"A key priority with Enhanced Care was to make insurance rates more affordable and to keep them that way, and this rate application continues to deliver on that," said Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General. "We are pleased that, during this time of

rising inflation and the cost of everyday life increasing, ICBC is able to keep Basic insurance rates stable for British Columbians for another two years."

If the BCUC approves the application, British Columbians will continue to benefit from stable and more affordable basic auto insurance rates for another two years.

### 5. Take care of yourself




